Job Description: Clinical Supervisor

Responsibilities:

Provide clinical supervision and support to licensed and associate therapists.

Oversee the assessment, treatment, and case management of clients in the sex offender treatment program.

Ensure that all clinical services are provided in accordance with relevant laws, regulations, and ethical standards.

Conduct regular case reviews and provide feedback to staff.

Assist in the development and implementation of treatment plans.

Provide training and professional development opportunities to therapists.

Collaborate with other members of the treatment team to ensure integrated care for clients.

Qualifications:

A valid license to practice as a licensed clinical psychologist, social worker, or counselor in the state of California.

At least 3 years of experience in the field of forensic psychology or a related area.

Previous experience in providing clinical supervision is desired, but not necessary.

Strong knowledge of evidence-based practices and modalities in therapy.
